§. 1.

Es verleiht der Verein zum Schutze deutscher Einwanderer in Texas dem Herrn

*Johann Valentin Braeutigam*  
*Kallenlengsfeld*

*Sieben*

nach seiner Familie, bestehend aus

nachher vier für sich, seine Familie, seine Erben und Rechtsnachfolger in besser form Rechtens ansummt, 320, sage dreihundert und zwanzig acres Landes, zu entsamen von seinem Landverreien, gelegen in der heutigen county San Antonio, Republik Texas, sowie seiner Landstrich gegemüßig daliegt, in dem Zustand, in welchem er sich derzeit befindet, und wie dieses dem Einwanderer durch einen Agenten des Vereins an Ort und Stelle werden bezeugt werden.

§. 2.

Es kauft der Einwanderer den ihm überwießen Landstrich als Eigenthümer, ungeachtet in allen im Eigenthume liegenden Rechten, vom Tage der Besitz-Einweisung an gerechnet, ohne jedoch während einem Zeitraum von drei Jahren, von bezeichneter Epoche an gerechnet, diesen Landstrich ganz oder theilweise veräußern zu können.

§. 3.

Es findet dieser Uebertrag des Landes unter folgenden weiteren Bedingungen Statt.

Es hat der Einwanderer

- 1) drei nacheinanderfolgende Jahre, vom Tage der Besitz-Einweisung an gerechnet, auf den bewilligten Landverreien zu wohnen;
- 2) in demselben Zeitraume fünfzehn acres Land zu umzäunen und in Cultur zu erhalten;
- 3) ein Wohnhaus auf seinem Grund und Boden zu errichten;
- 4) sich von dem Vereine entworfenen Colonisations-Pläne und den gesetzlichen Bestimmungen des Landes im Allgemeinen zu unterwerfen.

§. 4.

Die betreffenden Landes-Bewilligungsscheine sollen dem Einwanderer zur Last, der Verein aber legt dieselben vor: es sollen für diesen Vorfuß sowohl, als alle andern dem Einwanderer durch den Verein etwa gemachten Vortheile, die unversehrt bewilligten Landverreien und die darauf aufgesetzten Gebäude und Vorrichtungen als Pfand, bis zur gütlichen Abtragung der Schuld.

§. 5.

Gegenwärtiger provisorischer Erwerbstitel wird in Texas selbst durch eine von der territorialen Regierung ausgestellte, auf den Namen des Einwanderers lautende, definitive Eigenthums-Urkunde, umgetauscht, und zwar drei Jahre nach der Besitz-Einweisung, und wenn die oben beschriebenen Bedingungen von Seiten des Einwanderers erfüllt werden sind.

§. 6.

Bei nicht pünktlicher Erfüllung obiger Bedingungen durch den Einwanderer, verliert derselbe seine Rechte auf gegenwärtige Verleihung, und es fallen die auf den Verein im verließenen Landverreien aufgesetzten Gebäude, so wie die Landverreien selbst dem Vereine als Entschädigung anheim.

Gegenwärtiger Vertrag soll pünktlich und treu von den Contractanten in allen Punkten gehandhabt und beabachtet werden, was dieses amiti durch eigenhändige Namensunterschrift geloben.

The grant of 320 acres of land to each of the 22 emigrants was made on the 12th of October 1845. The emigrants were taken to Galveston on the 12th of October 1845, and landed at Galveston on the 12th of October 1845.

That *Wolfgang Braeutigam* one of the emigrants introduced as a colonist under a certain contract of colonization entered upon between the Government of the Republic of Texas and Henry F. Fisher and B. Miller, bearing date the 1st day of September, A. D. 1843, and by the latter assigned and transferred to the German Emigration and Railroad Company, do by these presents acknowledge and declare, that I arrived in Texas on board the *Texas Delivered* from Bremen at the port of Galveston on the eighteenth day of December A. D. 1845 and that by virtue of said colonization contract, I am being a single man over the age of 17 years entitled to a conditional grant of *Three hundred and twenty* acres of land. Now to it known, that I the said *Wolfgang Braeutigam* do by these presents accept the same upon the terms and conditions in the said colonization contract set forth and contained, and I do for myself, my heirs and administrators, in consideration of the trouble and expenses of the said Company, had for transportation and otherwise, also in consideration of One Dollar to me in hand paid by the said Company, the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, and in pursuance of the permission granted to me in the said colonization contract, by these presents release, assign and set over unto the said German Emigration and Railroad Company, the one-half of the said *Three hundred and twenty* acres being *One hundred and sixty* acres of land, together with all my right, claim and interest, of, in and out of the same, in fee simple. In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal by way of seal, this the *twenty second* day of *March* A. D. 1847.

D. 1848, intestate in law, by the German Emigration Company witness of the Colonization Contract of Fisher and Miller with the President of the late Republic of Texas: that he was a married man & arrived November 1845, when he was 61 years of age, and that he departed this life in the year A. D. One thousand eight hundred and forty six.  
 Be it then for further known, that the said Heirs of the said Valentin Braeutigam are entitled to receive six hundred and forty acres of land within the limits of the Colony of the said Fisher and Miller: for which this Certificate is issued to the said Heirs subject, however to the following Condition viz: that before a Patent can issue hereon the said heirs of the said Valentin Braeutigam deceased, shall, within two years from the date hereof settle within the limits of the Colony of the said Fisher and Miller.

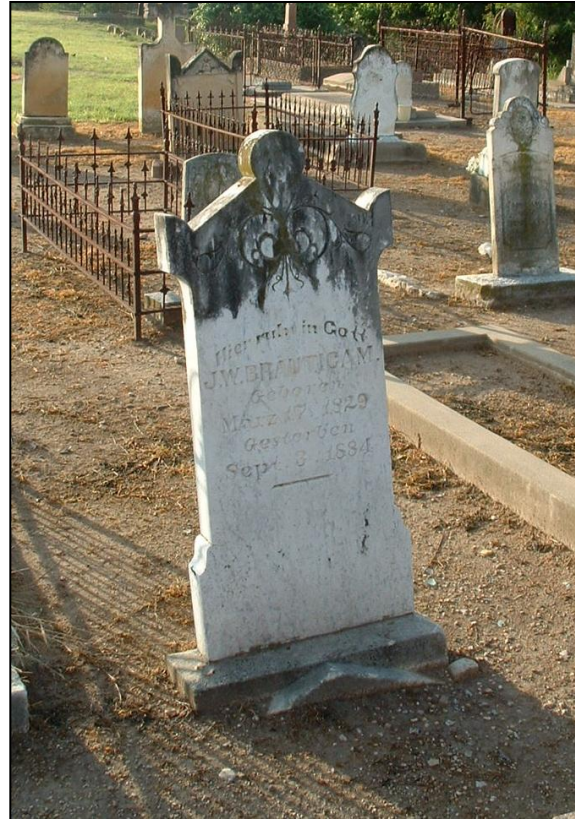
**The Murder Of  
John W. Braeutigam**

Mr. Wolfgang Braeutigam, or John Braeutigam, as he was commonly called, was the owner of a place for entertainment located about two miles from Fredericksburg on the San Antonio road. He was a well-liked person and was about 55 years of age at the time of his unfortunate experience.

On September 3, 1884 four strangers entered his establishment and asked for some drinks. When he served them the drinks, one of the men drew his revolver and sought to empty the money chest. Mr. Braeutigam, who was a courageous man, reached for his musket which was standing in the corner when the robber's bullet struck him fatally. The money till contained only a small sum.

Since the business establishment was located some distance from the nearest residences, it enabled the perpetrators to escape unmolested. One of them was shot by a ranger in the lower country when he resisted arrest. Another was delivered to the local jail and met with death when the jail was destroyed by fire. A few years later the third one was shot to death above Mason and the fourth one, presumably the one who committed the murder, a fellow named Fannin, escaped.

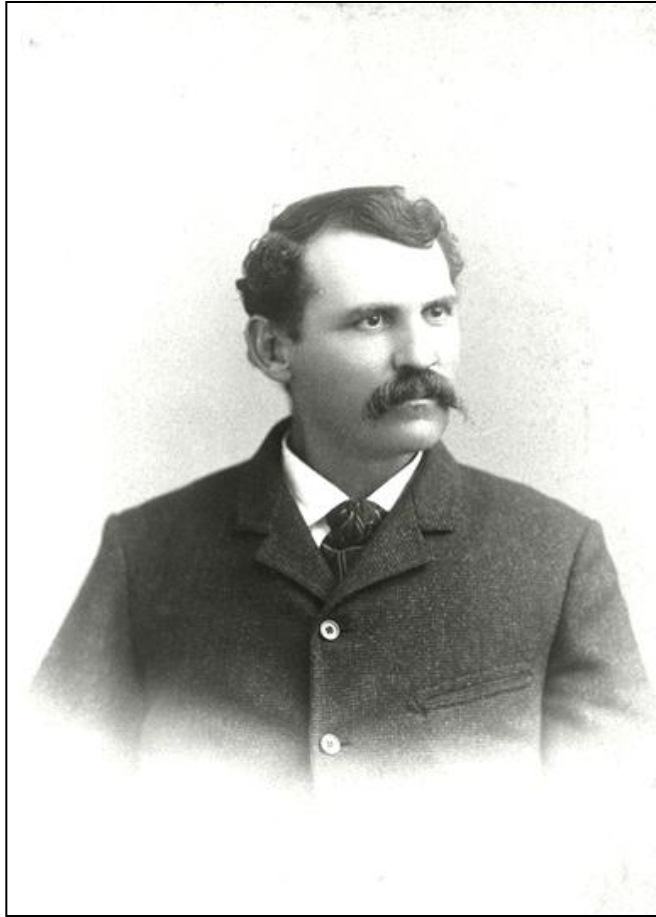

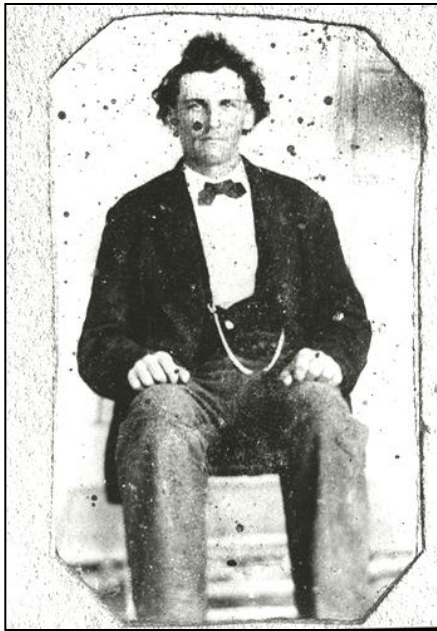

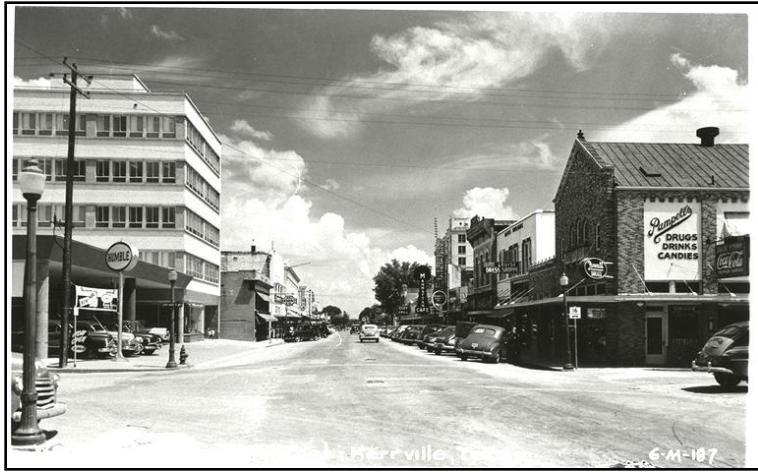

# Heart Attack Fatal to Mrs. J. L. Pampell

Prominent Woman Dies  
Suddenly While on  
Week End Outing

A pall of sadness was cast over the entire community shortly after noon Sunday when tragic news of the sudden death of Mrs. J. L. Pampell was flashed about.

Mrs. Pampell was stricken with a heart attack at 1 p. m. Sunday while enjoying a week end outing at the Pampell family camp on the L. A. Real ranch, 18 miles southwest of the city. She was accompanied to the camp Saturday evening by her husband, J. L. Pampell, Kerrville business man, and Mr. and Mrs. H. R. Anderson, who were guests at the camp.

During Saturday night Mrs. Pampell became ill, but her condition improved to such an extent that she arose about 11 o'clock Sunday morning and announced that she was feeling considerably better. While her husband and Mr. and Mrs. Anderson were seated at the table for the noon lunch, Mrs. Pampell passed through the room with a cheery greeting and went into an adjoining room. There a few moments later she was found dead.

A physician and an ambulance were hastily summoned to the camp; but the beloved woman had passed to her reward before medical aid arrived. It is believed that she expired within a short time after she walked through the dining room.

Funeral services were held Monday afternoon from the family residence, 427 Main Street, with Rev. F. M. Brasier, rector of St. Peter's Episcopal Church, and Rev. C. M. Epps, pastor of the First Methodist Church, in charge. Following a brief ceremony at the home, the sorrowing cortege proceeded to the Episcopal Church for a short ritual. Burial was in Glen Rest Cemetery under direction of Peterson Funeral Home.

Floral offerings banked high around the grave were final tributes from friends to the memory of a good woman whose influence had been widely felt during her 46 years' residence in Kerrville.

Before her marriage to J. L. Pampell on November 15, 1892, Mrs. Pampell was Miss Annie Braeutigam, the only daughter of Mr. and Mrs. A. Braeutigam. She was born at Gridley, Calif., on August 25, 1875, and at the age of 11 years moved to Kerrville with her parents. In her girlhood school days, she was a student at St. Mary's Hall in San Antonio.

Mrs. Pampell was a member of St. Peter's Episcopal Church and for many years was actively associated with the guilds and other church societies. While her first interests were in her home, she gave willingly of her time to civic and social work. She was a talented artist, gifted in music and a great lover of flowers.

It has been said that the beautiful new Episcopal Church in the city is not a little, a monument to the activities of Mrs. Pampell. She worked heartily with others to bring about the erection of this new edifice, which has been declared by artists to be one of the most beautiful in Texas.

Survivors of this faithful wife, devoted mother and exemplary daughter are the husband, J. L. Pampell; one son, Milton L. Pampell, and the aged mother, Mrs. Nellie Braeutigam, all of Kerrville.

Out-of-town relatives who came here to attend the last rites were: Mrs. I. P. Lochridge, Austin; Mrs. J. C. Day and daughter, Mrs. F. J. Hullstein, Brenham, sisters and niece of Mr. Pampell; Henry, Max and Otto Braeutigam of Fredericksburg, uncle and cousins of the deceased; Judge and Mrs. W. N. Pardue and son, Howard, of San Antonio.

# J.L. Pampell Rites Held

Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon for John Lee Pampell, 37, who came to Kerrville as a young railroader in 1891 and built his drug store into one of the finest in the Hill Country.

The pioneer businessman died in Sid Peterson Hospital Friday afternoon. About a week ago, he had fallen at his home, 220 Quinlan St., and broken his hip.

Rev. William P. Weeks of St. Peter's Episcopal Church officiated at the rites in Smith Funeral Home Chapel. Interment followed in Glen Rest Cemetery. He is survived by a son, Milton.

Pallbearers were Mayor Hilmar Pressler, Carter Beach, Orval Williams, Morgan Singleton, Jack Peterson, Tom Harrison, Dick Furman and H. T. Paul.

Mr. Pampell was active for many years in the Episcopal Church and the Rotary Club. He also was a Master Mason and a member of the Kerrville Lodge and the Alzar Shrine in San Antonio.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Annie, in 1932.

## Two Hurt Slightly In 3-Car Collision

When the Brenham-born young railroader decided to leave his work as a messenger on the old San Antonio and Aransas Pass railroad, he quickly decided to settle in the then-small village of Kerrville.

He picked the date of July 4, 1891, for his decision.

He came to town with his bone-handled straight razor and his other shirt wrapped in a red bandana handkerchief. He was 22 years old.

His first venture was a combination cafe, confectionary and fruit and vegetable emporium right next door to Capt. Charles Schreiner's big store on Water St.

He succeeded from the very first. His only trouble was the annoying habit of cattle walking up to his stand and munching on the produce.

Fifteen years later, Mr. Pampell added the Coca-Cola bottling franchise to his candy manufacturing business. In 1922, he took over Rawson's Drug Store and moved his varied business interests into the basement of that building.

The store still stands today as Pampell's on the corner of Water and Sidney Baker Sts.

The candy manufacturing business and the Coca-Cola franchise were sold some years ago, but the drug store is still being operated by Mr. Pampell's sole survivor, son Milton.

Up until his recent fall, Mr. Pampell came to the store every day and sat in a chair near the rear of the store, surrounded by many memories of watching Kerrville grow.

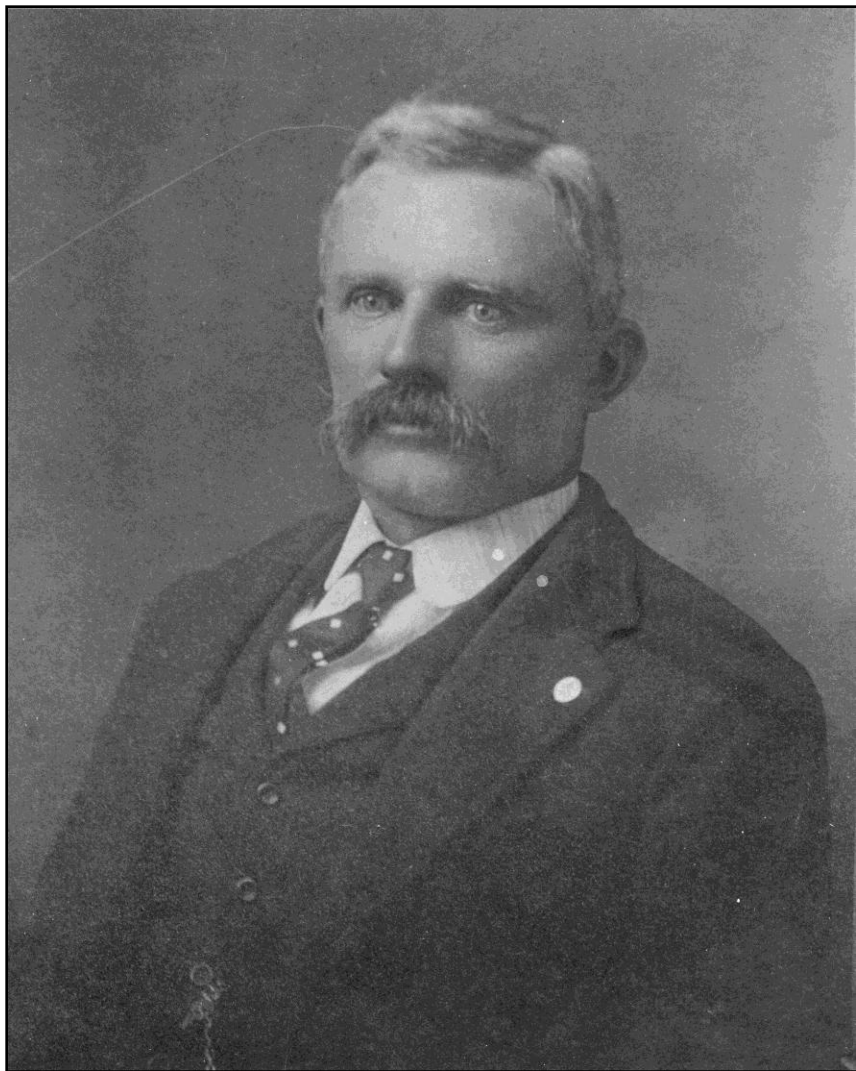

### Mrs. N. T. Dechert Surprised, 75th Birthday



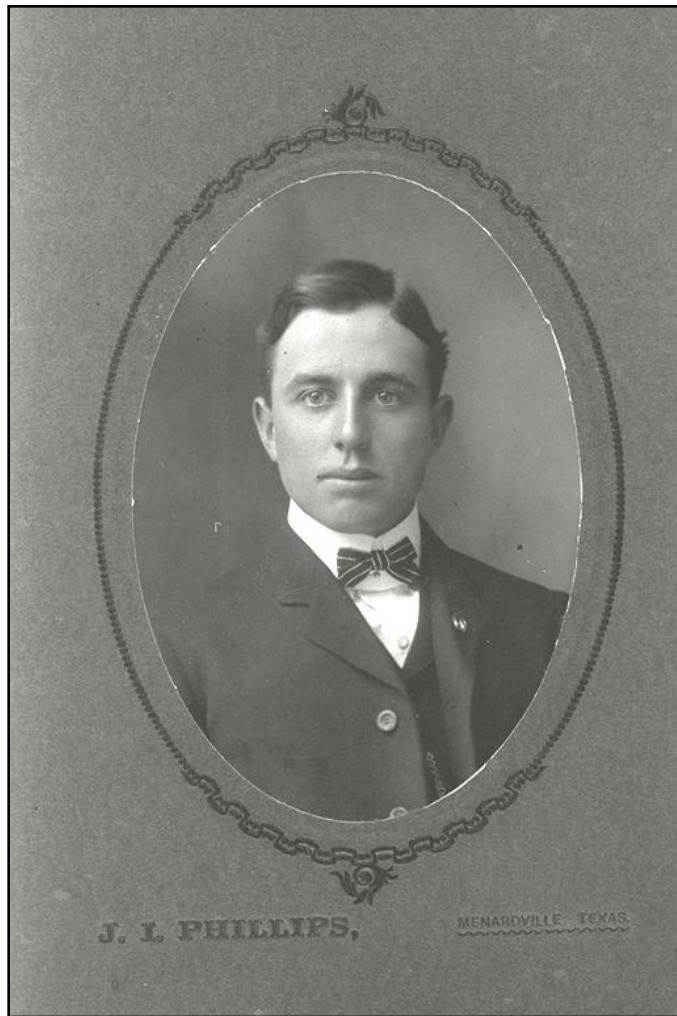
