Little Known Braeutigam Facts

Do you know what Braeutigam means in German. First you must know the correct spelling in Germany is Bräutigam. The 'ä' translates to 'ae' in the United States. In the German dictionary Bräutigam is defined as: (bride) groom; (*dated; Verbloter*) fiancé, betrothed (*old*), husband-to-be).

Most Bräutigams who came to the United States just kept the spelling: Brautigam. There are very few who changed it to Braeutigam. The Richard Valentin Brautigam family (the Braeutigams that moved to Jewett, Texas from Fredericksburg in the early 1900s) dropped the 'e' in their last name.

Mrs. Robert Krueger, 89, nee Viola Ann Braeutigam, died at the Rice residence in Cleveland, TX, at 9:55 a.m., on Monday, Nov. 9, 1992.

Funeral services were held on Thursday, Nov. 12, at 11 a.m., in the Beckmann Funeral Home, with the Rev. Rick Waters officiating. Interment was in the City Cemetery.

She was a native of Gillespie County and was born on May 20, 1903, the daughter of Henry Braeutigam and Clara Gold Braeutigam. She married Robert F. Krueger on Feb. 24, 1937, in Houston and he preceded her in death in January 1986.

She is survived by a daughter and son-in-law, Carolyn and David Rice of Cleveland, TX; six grandchildren and 15 great-grandchildren; a brother, Raymond Braeutigam of Fredericksburg; and three sisters-in-law' Mrs. Raymond Braeutigam; Lilly, Mrs. Edwin Braeutigam, both of Fredericksburg; and Olivia, Mrs. Harold Braeutigam of Seguin.

In addition to her husband, she was preceded in death by brothers, Egon, Edwin and Harold Braeutigam and sisters, Mrs. Hortense Foy and Mrs. Ollie Nichols.

Edgar (Durstie) Durst, 87, died on Tuesday, Dec. 21, 1993, in Knopp Nursing Home No. 1.

Funeral services were held on Thursday, Dec. 23, at 2 p.m., in the Fredericksburg United Methodist Church, with the Rev. Rick Waters and Rev. Jerry Somers officiating. Interment was in the Greenwood Cemetery.

Marilyn Jenkins was the organist for the services, Dr. Rolle Blondeau, the vocal soloist, and the Arion Male Choir, under the direction of Mark Hierholzer, sang.

Prior to the services, his body lay in state in the chapel of the Schaetter Funeral Home and in the Fredericksburg United Methodist Church.

Durst was a native of Gillespie and was born on Oct. 30, 1906, the son of Henry Durst and Sophia Metzger Durst. He married Eleanor Brodie on Feb. 18, 1939, in Castell, and she survives.

He attended the Palo Alto School and various automotive training courses through the Ford Motor Company. He was an automobile mechanic, a heavy equipment repairman and for

many years worked for the City of Fredericksburg.

Durst was member of the Fredericksburg United Methodist Church, the oldest living member of the Fredericksburg Social Turn Verein and a member of the Arion Male Choir and the Order of the Sons of Hermann.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by two brothers, a sister and their spouses; Louis Durst, Eugene and Elsie Durst, and Gertrude and Eddie Kott, all of Fredericksburg; and a sister-in-law, Jewell Durst of San Antonio.

He was preceded in death by a brother, Andrew (Andy) Durst, and a sister, Myrtle, who died in infancy.

John Henry Braeutigam, 67, died on Tuesday, Jan. 11, 1994, at his residence in Fredericksburg.

A Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated in St. Mary's Catholic Church at 11 a.m. on Friday, Jan. 14, with Reverends Patrick Marron and Paul Appel officiating. Mrs. C.L. Weinheimer was the organist and Rhonda Schaeffer, the vocalist. Entombment was in St. Mary's Catholic Cemetery Mausoleum.

A vigil service at 7 p.m., Thursday, by Rev. Charles Smith, followed with a rosary service by the Rev. Mr. Kenn Knopp were held in the Schaeffer Funeral Home Chapel where his body lay in state prior to the services.

He was born in Fredericksburg on May 29, 1926, the son of Walter and Cora Olfers Braeutigam. He married Rita Kammlah in Fredericksburg on May 30, 1948, and she survives.

Braeutigam served in the U.S. Army from Feb. 23, 1946, until Aug. 22, 1947, earning the American Theater Ribbon, the Meritorious Unit Award and the World War II Victory Ribbon.

He was a partner in Stehling Bros., Men's Store, retiring after selling the business in 1990.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by a daughter, Paulette Braeutigam of Austin; his mother, Mrs. Walter Braeutigam of Fredericksburg; three brothers and their spouses, Franklin (Buddy) and Ida Braeutigam of Fredericksburg, Frederick (Fritz) and Ann Braeutigam of Temple, and Jerry and Jenny Braeutigam of Austin; and a sister and brother-in-law, Agnes and George Mains of Kerrville.

Fredericksburg area has new Area Code

Fredericksburg and much of the area of central and south Texas (including Kerrville and San Antonio) will convert to the 210 area code effective November 1, 1992. From November 1, 1992, until May 2, 1993, calls to telephone numbers in the new 210 area code will automatically be connected, even if the 512 area code is dialed. The additional lead time will give callers an opportunity to become used to dialing the new area code.

The Pampell Opera House

(Texas Historical Marker)

Originally a frame structure, this building was completed about 1895. It housed the M. V. Gregory Hotel and store when local merchant John L. Pampell (1871-1958) bought the site in 1901. He converted the second floor into a 450-seat auditorium and used the ground floor for the manufacture and sale of candy, ice cream, and carbonated drinks. The Pampell Opera House became a popular site for plays, concerts, traveling acts, and various civic functions, but by the 1920s movies began replacing the live shows. Traces of the opera house are still evident inside the building.

Editor's note: John L. Pampell married Annie Braeutigam (of the August Braeutigam family) in 1892 in Kerrville, Texas. John and Annie had only one child, Milton Pampell. Milton married Lillie Pardue and they had no children. Milton passed away in 1974 and Lucille passes away in 1987.
